



Scientists and Engineers in Mississippi, 2005

This profile summarizes the demographic, social, and economic characteristics of the 35,155 people in Mississippi's science and engineering (S&E) labor force. In 2005, the unemployment rate for Mississippi's S&E labor force was 2% and median earnings were \$44,460. Mississippi ranked number 43 out of 50 states and DC in the share of people working in S&E occupations.






Share of labor force in S&E occupations



In 2005, engineers accounted for the largest share of Mississippi's S&E labor force (43%). Median earnings for engineers in Mississippi were \$46,045, compared with \$60,890 for engineers nationwide. 15% of Mississippi's engineers were racial or ethnic minorities.
